### **USC-Upstate: Beaumont History**

Presentation at the Mill, August 1st, 5:30 PM

Come to a special meeting at the Mill (lower level; look for signs) for a presentation by Dr. Paul Grady, history professor at USC-Upstate, to learn about an exciting opportunity for us to partner with others in preserving our local history. Dr. Grady wants to outline the basics of a grant proposal his group is working on. Also to find residents (and others) with historical connections to the mill and the Village who are interested in sharing their family history and connections with the mill, possibly including photos and artifacts. It will all be digitized for the county library. Tell your friends & relatives.

We know there is a great deal of interest in Beaumont's history, but the BVA and the library have not had the resources to preserve that history—possibly until now. Dr. Grady and associates in the history department are working on a grant from the National Endowment for the Humanities, "Landmarks in American History." Their objective is to develop a seminar for history teachers, and they want to use Beaumont as a model, using our story to help teachers develop skills in local history preservation. In the process we would get professional help in preserving family histories, photos, & artifacts and some of us may act as resource persons for the project itself.

The grant proposal is due in February and the grant would be awarded next summer; 72 educators from around the country would attend two one-week seminars in the summer of 2020.


